The Aboriginal Heritage Council is a Statutory Council under the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1975* and consists of not more than 10 members. Members are appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, for terms of up to three years.

The Aboriginal Heritage Council provides advice and recommendations to the Minster for Aboriginal Affairs on a broad range of matters that impact Aboriginal cultural heritage values in Tasmania. This includes Aboriginal heritage permits, Aboriginal cultural heritage values in the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area and consulting with Aboriginal people and community organisations. The Aboriginal Heritage Council also supports the development of information materials to inform the public and potential proponents about the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1975, and best practice in managing Aboriginal cultural heritage values.

The Tasmanian Government is seeking applications from Aboriginal people to be appointed to the Aboriginal Heritage Council. Expressions of Interest are encouraged from Aboriginal people with skills, qualifications, knowledge, or experience in Aboriginal cultural heritage values management, Aboriginal cultural values presentation and interpretation, as well as experience in leadership and governance.

The Tasmanian Government is committed to a target of 50 per cent representation of women across government boards and committees.
