The Aboriginal Heritage Council is a Statutory Council under the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1975 and consists of not more than 10 members. Members are appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, for terms of up to three years.

The Council provides advice and recommendations to the Minister on a broad range of matters that impact Aboriginal heritage, including permits, consulting with Aboriginal community organisations, and Aboriginal cultural values in the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area. The Council also supports the development of information materials to inform the public and potential proponents about the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1975*, and best practice in managing Aboriginal heritage.

The Tasmanian Government is seeking nominations from Aboriginal people to be appointed to the Council. Nominations are encouraged from Aboriginal people with skills, qualifications, knowledge, or experience in Aboriginal heritage management, cultural values presentation and interpretation, as well as experience in leadership and governance.

The Tasmanian Government is committed to a target of 50 per cent representation of women across government boards and committees. There are currently three male-identified positions, and one female-identified position, available.

The ability to liaise, as part of the Council, effectively with the Director of National Parks and Wildlife and the Minister, specialists, senior staff, and stakeholders, and negotiate outcomes that meet specified requirements.
